Harassment Reports Filed 2017-2018 School Year

The Penta Career Center Board of Education encourages the promotion of positive interpersonal relationships between members of the school community. Harassment/bullying is defined as any intentional written, verbal, or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another particular student more than once and the behavior causes both:

- mental or physical harm to the student;
- severe, persistent, or pervasive that creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student.

Ohio Revised Code (3319.321) requires that the Penta Career Center administration semiannually provide the president of the district board a written summary of all reported incidents and post the summary on its web site, if the district has a web site.

During the first semester of the 2017-2018 school year, Penta Career Center had seven (7) incidences of harassment that would meet the definition by law.
