

# NEW TRAINING FACILITY BUILT BY STUDENTS FOR STUDENTS

This past school year students and staff in Penta Career Center's Construction programs began building a full-size house on campus that will be used as a training facility for several of our programs. The house is still under construction, but it should be ready for use by the end of the year.

The Public Safety – Firefighter program will use the house for many training exercises such as search and rescue, ladder training, emergency bail-outs for firefighters, and command training. In addition, the program will use smoke simulation in many of their exercises. Instructors from the Bowling Green State University State Fire School assisted with planning and preparation of the training facility and the activities that will take place.

The Public Safety – Criminal Justice programs will also conduct training at the house. The students will participate in crime scene investigations, simulate hostage situations, and conduct room entry and clear out exercises.

The interior and exterior of the house will be used by the Construction programs for skill training in areas such as drywall, flooring and masonry work.



# STUDENTS WIN NATIONAL CONTESTS!





This spring, two Penta Career Center students, **Destinique Conley** (Anthony Wayne) and **Alex Mitov** (Bowling Green), competed in national competitions through their career-technical student organizations and earned first place awards.

Conley, a sophomore in the Medical Technologies program, competed in the Speaking Skills contest at the HOSA International Leadership Conference in Orlando, Florida on June 21. She qualified for the national competition by earning first place in the same contest at the Ohio HOSA Leadership Conference.

Alex Mitov, a senior in the Information Technologies Academy, earned first place in the Computer Security competition at the Business Professionals of America (BPA) National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, California. In addition, Mitov received third place in the Virtual Cybersecurity presentation at the contest. Mitov qualified for nationals by earning second place in the Ohio BPA competition earlier in the year. The fact that Mitov placed first in the nation in a computer-technology contest is especially impressive because he is blind.

# Penta Hosts SkillsUSA Ohio Northwest Regional Competition

Penta was proud to be the host site of the 2019 SkillsUSA Ohio Northwest Regional Competition on February 15, 2019. This was the first time in more than 20 years that Penta has hosted a regional event for SkillsUSA. Penta staff worked for a year to organize the event, and nearly every staff member helped in some way. More than 500 area high school students, who study career-technical education programs, participated. The competition was the largest Regional SkillsUSA event in Ohio.

The event featured 38 competitions with student competitors from nearly 22 schools in

Northwest Ohio. Penta had 100 students compete, and 39 students earned either a gold, silver or bronze medal and qualified for the Ohio SkillsUSA Championships.

SkillsUSA is a national nonprofit organization serving teachers and high school and college students who are preparing for careers in trade, technical and skilled service occupations, including health occupations. The organization provides quality educational experiences such as leadership, teamwork, citizenship, and character development skills.





## SIGNING DAY GENERATES EXCITEMENT



This spring, Penta held its first-ever Signing Day events for new students to introduce them to career-technical education and their Penta programs. The new students attended Signing Day ceremonies on April 30 and May 2, where they signed letters of intent indicating their official commitment to attend Penta. The events were similar in format to signing day activities that high school athletes and their families participate in with colleges.

The energetic and fast-paced Signing Day activities created excitement and memories for our new students. After signing their letters of intent, the students received a baseball hat and pen and took photos with their families, friends and future classmates. The students also received a congratulatory letter from Lieutenant Governor Jon Husted. At the end of the event, students participated in an orientation activity in their career-technical program.

# BENEFITS OF ATTENDING PENTA

**Industry Credentials** – Penta students earned 1,471 Industry Credentials during the 2018-2019 school year.

College Credit Plus (CCP) — During the 2018-2019 school year 550 Penta students (both on campus and through satellite programs) participated in CCP courses through either Owens Community College, The University of Toledo or Bowling Green State University. These students had the ability to earn 3,123 CCP credits through their participation. CCP gives students the opportunity to take college level course work while attending high school.

Advanced Career - Penta continues to enhance its Advanced Career curricular offerings. By fusing a rigorous academic core with challenging project work and advanced technology in a career pathway program of study, Advanced Career courses give students a greater depth of knowledge and skills to prepare them for more options after high school. New for the 2019-2020 school year is the addition of Advanced Career: Clean Energy Technology, which includes the Clean Energy Systems course. Any student has the opportunity to take this course and earn simultaneous Math and Science credit. Penta continues to offer Advanced Career training and simultaneous credit opportunities through the Construction Electricity and Computer-Aided Design programs.

Simultaneous Credits - Continuing this school year, students can earn simultaneous credits in four other career-technical programs. Students in the Welding program (junior year) will earn simultaneous credit in Math. Additionally, senior students in the Medical Technologies Academy, Dental Assistant and Exercise Science & Sports Medicine programs will receive simultaneous credit in English.

### PENTA-BOWLING GREEN SITE NOW OPEN

In January, Penta Career Center opened a new a 7,200-square-foot building at 760 West Newton Road in Bowling Green. The building includes two classrooms for 11th and 12th grade students who are enrolled in Career Based Intervention (CBI) classes from the Bowling Green and Otsego Schools. In addition, the new facility has lab space for several Adult Education classes that will be offered beginning in October 2019.

Penta, in conjunction with the Bowling

Green Chamber of Commerce, plans to host a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the new building on October 15.
