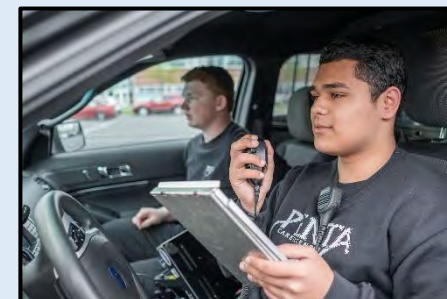
Criminal Justice is designed for students who want to pursue employment in criminal justice, private/public safety, or pursue post-secondary education leading to employment in a law-related field.

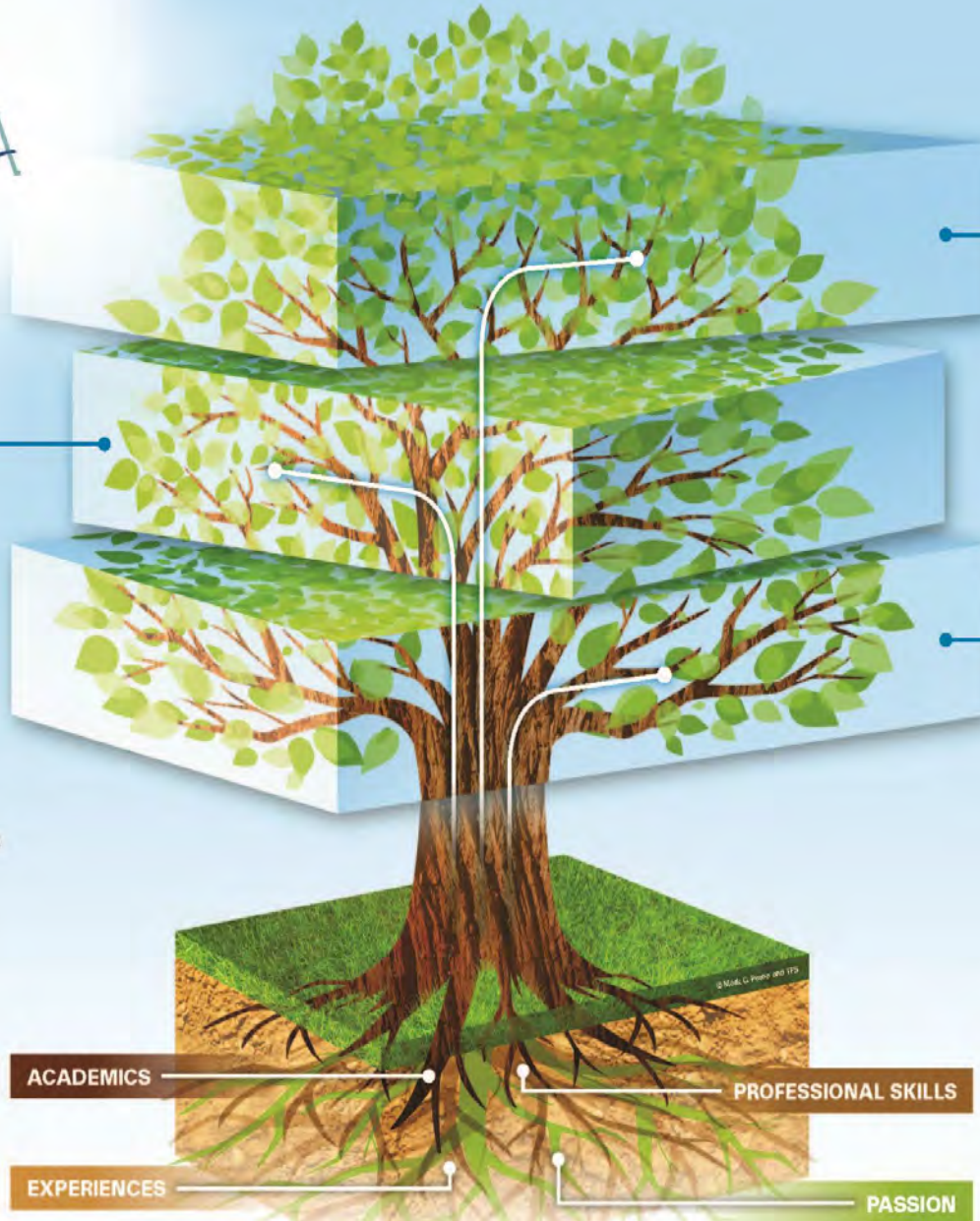
