EDTL 2010 INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION

(3 BGSU CCP CREDITS)

- Create a career plan and learn about the professional guidelines and ethical practices of education
- Develop own personal educational beliefs and values
- Complete field experiences at various grade levels (early childhood, middle childhood, special education & student choice)

EDTL 2300: INTRODUCTION TO EDUCATION TECHNOLOGY

(3 BGSU CCP Credits)

- Develop age-appropriate learning experiences and curriculum to engage children and help them learn
- Create lesson plans, and employ grading and assessment strategies to measure a student's progress
- Develop online instruction using learning management system platforms.

EDIS 2310: INTRODUCTION TO Teaching Students with Disabilities (2 BGSU CCP Credits)

- Provides an overview of the development and characteristics of students with exceptional learning needs; historical, philosophical, and legal issues in special education; instructional strategies and adaptations of learning environments; and consultation and collaboration to meet the needs of all students.

EDFI 2980: SCHOOL, SOCIETY, AND CULTURAL DIVERSITY

(3 BGSU CCP CREDITS)

- Examine contemporary problems and issues related to schooling within the United States, by investigating the history and philosophies that have shaped education in the United States
- Development of a coherent professional view of educational theory and practice informed by understanding of key issues of cultural diversity and education
- Explore concepts in society and education, such as dominant and minority cultures, socialization, agency, equality, racism, and classism
