As a Welding student, Patrick worked 40 hours a week at the same time he was finishing his senior year of high school. After completing his Welding training and graduating from Rossford High School in 1973, Patrick passed a Welding test and obtained a job at the Jeep Corporation.

Patrick is an advocate of the trades. He believes his experience as a welder taught him many life lessons.

“I learned to work hard, efficiently, and with purpose,” says Patrick.

Patrick worked at Jeep for 30 years. During his time at Jeep, he worked as a welder in the body shop and also held other positions in the factory. Experiencing two career-technical programs at Penta Career Center was not what Marty Self originally planned to do while in high school. However, his strong interest in fixing computers convinced him to change his career path while at Penta.

“I tried out Interactive Media for one year, but I was drawn to A+ Computer Technology and was proud to be able to complete this two-year program in one year,” says Marty.

Marty graduated from Springfield High School and completed his Penta program in 2004. He credits Penta and instructor, Dan Wyandt, for providing guidance and a firm foundation for his success in the information technology industry.

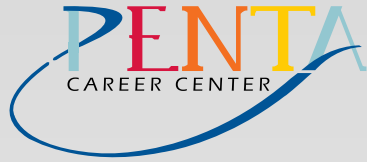
