### PENTA EARNS 2022 Pacesetter School Award

For the third time since 2018, Penta Career Center has once again been honored with the Gene Bottoms Pacesetter School Award from the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB). Penta was recognized on July 19 during the Making Schools Work Conference in Grapevine, Texas.

The 2022 Pacesetter School Award recognized Penta for its innovative practices in the Job Training and Transition to Independence, Employment & Success (TIES) programs. **Ryan Myers**, supervisor of special education, accepted the award that recognized the work of **Amanda Williams** and **Megan Haig**, both Job Training coordinators, and **Rebecca Knapp**, TIES coordinator.

Throughout the years, the instructors have developed successful programs for students with disabilities. The Job Training students participate in a broad range of work-based learning experiences by volunteering in the community. Students in the TIES program work as interns at various sites at The University of Toledo. As a result of these programs, students are able to set goals, live independently and gain employment.



Miller will be attending Owens Community College to study computer programming technology.

Meghan Rose (Lake), from the Medical Technologies program, earned first place and a gold medal in the Nursing Assisting contest at the 2022 HOSA – Future Health Professionals International Leadership Conference. Rose competed against hundreds of students from across the world during the conference, which was held in Nashville, Tennessee in June. Rose plans to pursue a degree in a health-related field at either Owens Community College or Bowling Green State University.

In July, three students from Penta's Family & Consumer Sciences programs in the Anthony Wayne Local School District, earned first place in the nation at the 2022 FCCLA National Leadership Conference in San Diego, California. The national winners were: **Grace Emahiser** – the Chapter Service Project contest; **Grant Hubley** – the Public Policy Advocate contest; and **Aradhya Muthumula** – the Instructional Video Design contest. Hubley also earned a \$1,000 grant for FCCLA Stand Up, a national peer education program and a Franklin Covey Leadership Award.

# **NEW STUDENTS ENJOY 2022 SIGNING DAY**

This past April, new students had the opportunity to participate in Penta Career Center's 2022 Signing Day events. About 328 students and their families attended Signing Day to formally sign letters of intent indicating their official commitment to attend Penta. The students enjoyed meeting their teachers and fellow classmates prior to the ceremony. After the ceremony, they celebrated with their teachers and families. The energetic and fast-paced Signing Day activities generated excitement and memories for the new students.

### **Professional Development Day A Hit With Students**

Penta Career Center provided a unique opportunity this past school year for high school students to gain a competitive advantage. The first-ever Career Readiness Day, held in October 2021, offered all current students the chance to learn more about careers, participate in mock interviews, and listen to presentations about employability skills, adult responsibilities and healthy living skills. A college fair was also held during the event with 50 post-secondary institutions in attendance.

The event, organized by a team of Penta staff members, challenged the entire staff to submit speaker ideas from a variety of topics that would help prepare students for the future. Staff contacted advisory committee members, career professionals, alumni, and community agencies to find presenters for Career Readiness Day.
